The Narcolepsy Association (UK) is an unincorporated association governed by a constitution adopted in 1983 and revised on 17 November 1990 and 25 September 1999 and 17 October 2008. It is a registered charity (No. 326361).

Since the last year's report the following trustees have resigned: Glenda Wood in April, Marc Vincent in July and Jennie Emms in October.

When a vacancy occurs for a trustee, the remaining trustees will seek to appoint an individual with skills and experience which they feel will be of benefit to the charity.

On appointment, a new trustee would be given a copy of the original Trust Deed and the latest Annual Report and Accounts. There is no formal induction and training programme but trustees are provided with literature from the Charity Commission which explains their role and responsibilities, and individual trustees may attend seminars to update themselves when they feel it necessary.

#### Objectives for the public benefit

The Association is established for the benefit, relief and aid of persons suffering from Narcolepsy.

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

#### **Review Of Developments, Activities and Achievements**

The association saw the departure of key members of the committee during the period. Glenda Wood, our former chair, resigned as a trustee in April 2008 due to health problems. Marc Vincent resigned in July and Jennie Emms in October. Their knowledge and experience has been missed.

New committee members during the period were Emma Fosberg as a full member; Ed Coates and Kay Underwood were co-opted at the first meeting following the AGM.

Three editions of the Catnap newsletter were issued during the period under review.

Although we have a steady increase in new members each year the overall numbers are in decline. This has had an impact on income recived from members' subscriptions, falling some £250.

Two large legacies were received in this year: just over £187,000 and £44,600 from the estates of Mr W H F Turner and Mrs Edna Snape respectively. As a result of these the committee has been considering suitable ways of using this money to improve and expand the association. Two of the areas under scrutiny are to revitalise the local support groups and improve awareness of narcolepsy throughout the medical profession and the general public. We are hoping to bring in some major changes; some of which will require greater involement by the membership at large.

The annual conference was held at Ratcliffe College in October 2008 and received favourable feedback from those who attended. Among the speakers was Dr Chris Hanning, a Consultant in Sleep Medicine at University Hospitals Leicester, who gave a presentation on pharmaceuticals for narcolepsy and cataplexy.

Helen Perry, a trainee clinical psychologist at Evelina Children's Hospital gave a presentation on using Cognitive Behavioural Therapy(CBT) to manage cataplexy.

Membership of the association as at 31 March 2009 stood at 520.

#### **Financial review**

Currently, the Charity has uncommitted funds of £259,029. In deciding the level of unrestricted reserve, the Trustees consider it necessary to set aside a sum sufficient to allow the charity continue trading for a period of twelve months.

### INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

### TO THE TRUSTEES OF NARCOLEPSY ASSOCIATION (UK)
